Money Matters

The budget for 2025-2026 has been set at £255m which is an increase of \pounds 11.6m (4.8%) from 2024-2025.

Funding for policing comes from a combination of Central Government, council tax and grant income. For 2025-2026 the Government provides 56% of the budget figure and 44% comes from local taxpayers.

This means the amount of council tax a Band D property will pay towards policing will increase by 27p per week.

How Your Money is Spent

- 39.4% Policing in Your Neighbourhoods
- 21.9% Enabling Services and Central Functions
- 16.2% Investigating Crime and Protecting Vulnerable People
- 8.6% Contact and Call Centre
- 5.7% Regional Policing
- 4.5% Detaining and Prosecuting Offenders
- 3.9% Crime Prevention and Partnerships
- 0.7% Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner

In 2024 Leicestershire Police:

- Received 197,445 emergency contacts (541 per day)
- Recorded:
 - 10,000+ reports of anti-social behaviour
 - 95,563 crimes reported
 - o 4,338 missing people
- Attended 68,900 emergency and priority incidents (189 per day)
