Title: Partnership Locality Fund 2014/15:

Summary of Issue:

The revised Commissioning Framework for 2014/17 sets out how the PCC intends to align the commissioning budget with the key themes and strategic priorities in the Police and Crime Plan. It includes four funding mechanisms – one of which is the Partnership Locality Fund (PLF).

In 2014/15 the budget for the PLF was £330,000. Community Safety Partnerships were invited to submit business cases for this funding. The PLF was available for the following commissioning intentions:

When allocated against the total recorded crime and anti-social behaviour (relevant to the specific commissioning intentions) during 2012/13, this equated to:

CSPs also had the option to set aside up to 10% of their allocation (i.e. the figures above) to create a reactionary contingency fund. This will be held by the OPCC and remain available until 31st October 2014. These funds can be accessed by liaising with the OPCC and agreeing the purpose, outcomes and timing.

The business cases were evaluated by 3 staff within the OPCC and recommendations made to the PCC.

Recommendations presented:

1. Approve the funding allocations and distributions set out in Table 1 (attached).

Key discussion points at meeting:

The PCC requested clarification on the following business cases:

Safer Leicester Partnership - Anti-Social Behaviour Victim Support for Leicester City

It was noted that this initiative could also contribute to a reduction in ASB as the Incremental Approach used is designed to achieve long term behavioural changes with perpetrators of anti-social behaviour. This can take time alongside gathering sufficient evidence to support any application for a legal sanction. Therefore the need for victims and witnesses to have support through this process is essential as without their input and evidence it is not always possible to tackle those perpetrating anti-social behaviour.

NW Leicestershire – Tackling Violent Crime

Further details of the implementation plan should be shared when available and this will form part of the funding agreement.

Harborough and Oadby & Wigston - Warning Zone

Warning Zone consists of a number of interactive learning zones. A discussion took place about how closely aligned the zone themes were with the relevant commissioning intentions. It was also recognised that a PCC Grant application had been submitted by Warning Zone to cover Leicestershire and Rutland and this may lead to duplicate funding. It was agreed that allocations of funding for Warning Zone via the Harborough and Oadby & Wigston Community Safety Partnerships should be considered following the PCC Grant Review Panel on 7th March 2014.

It was resolved that :

The recommendations set out above be accepted and implemented to support the delivery of the Police and Crime Plan.
