Title: Ministry of Justice Funding for Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence Support Services

Summary of Issue:

In April 2022 the Ministry of Justice (MoJ) confirmed that in addition to their core funding, Police and Crime Commissioners would receive an additional £15.7m funding for domestic abuse and sexual violence support services. Police and Crime Commissioners were required to make this funding opportunity available to commissioned services and frontline providers. This opportunity was advertised on the OPCC website and using our mailing list, requesting that providers in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland completed and returned a needs assessment, which was then submitted to the MoJ.

The bids received as part of the provider's needs assessments totalled £753,581.00.

A total of 16 bids were submitted from providers, 15 of which the OPCC supported. The OPCC did not support a bid from Advocacy After Fatal Domestic Abuse due to the organisation being a national organisation with a limited local demand.

As part of their need's assessments, providers were asked if part funding was feasible, and at what percentage. The 15 supported bids submitted, considering those that could accept part funding, totalled £601,918.00. These bids were prioritised by local need.

On the 16th of June 2022 the OPCC were notified of our success in securing £435,343 towards domestic abuse and sexual violence support services in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland for the next three years. The OPCC were able to allocate this sum to the first 12 of the 15 supported bids, following the prioritisation of local need. Unfortunately, a bid from The New Futures Project for the employment of a Social Worker was unsuccessful, due to it being lower on prioritisation list. Two bids from Freeva, for a Domestic Abuse Counsellor and Sexual Violence SARC Counsellor, were also unsuccessful. This was due to Freeva underspending on funding previously awarded by the MoJ, which if awarded again could pose a risk to the OPCC.

Key discussion points

First Step Leicester Leicestershire and Rutland requested £29,450.00 for 2023/24 and 2024/25 only due to already receiving funding from the MoJ for 2022/23. This enabled the OPCC to award Innovating Minds CIC with £29,450.00, who would otherwise have been unsuccessful in securing funding, for 2022/23 only.
