Decision summary:

IT require the upgrade and support for the current DS3000 Integrated Communication Control System (ICCS). This considered better value and within budget costs to Leicestershire Police.

It was agreed to procure by direct award using the Crown Commercial Service (CCS) RM6259 Vertical Applications Solution framework.

This produced one compliant offer from SSS Public Safety (SSSPS). Procurement is requesting that the Police Commissioner signs the contract and adds his seal.

A search was made on CCS eMarketplace portal using the following key words, "RM6259 ICCS". This produced one compliant offer from SSS Public Safety (SSPS). As we currently have the DS3000 ICCS, SSSPS have offer a discount on their full implementation price.

The recommendation has been agreed by IT Communication Architect, supported by the Head of Procurement and approved by the Assistant Chief Officer - Finance.

1) Background information

A search was made on CCS eMarketplace portal using the following key words, "RM6259 ICCS". This produced one compliant offer from SSS Public Safety. Procurement is requesting that the Police Commissioner signs the contract and adds his seal and the recommendation was approved by the Assistant Chief Officer - Finance.

3) Expected benefits.

An upgrade was proposed previously as part of the ESN replacement of the Airwave radio network, but for many well documented reasons that didn't happen.

This has meant that our ICCS has remained on windows server 2012 which is no longer fully supported by Microsoft. This quote is to bring all ICCS supported equipment, hardware and software up to the latest supported version.

4) Impact of not approving the application

If the application isn't supported Leicestershire Police's ICCS will not be fully supported by Microsoft and the software will be out of date.

5) Financial implications (including any cost savings)

The total price for the upgrade and support for three years, with two options to extend for one year, is £893,972.00 .

IT have evaluated the options and an upgrade is better value than a totally new ICCS.
