Purpose of Report

1. The purpose of this report is to seek members' views on the ethical scenario outlined below.

Commentary

3. The Right Care Right Person (RCRP) model and National Partnership Agreement launched Wednesday 26 July.

Right Care Right Person is a new approach, piloted in Humberside, to ensure those in mental health crisis receive the right care from the right agency, improving the service and care they receive and freeing up police time. Estimates show that implementing the principles of Right Care Right Person could save around one million police officer hours each year.

Locally the force is implementing RCRP in a phased approach, however there is concern as to what happens to the most vulnerable of people if all agencies begin to pull back.

The PCC would like to Ethics and Transparency Panel to discuss the RCRP model from an ethical perspective and provide their thoughts for the PCC and the Force to take into consideration.
